

EDUCATION

- Education Trust Fund Budget: FY27 \$11 Billion (largest ever)
- SB209: Sex Ed Reform, move toward risk avoidance and abstinence as well as restrictions on explicit materials in K-4
- SB99: 10 Commandments alongside founding documents
- HB124: Loan Assistance in Support of Educators in Alabama. Program broadening loan forgiveness eligibility for educators
- HB78: Early development state guidelines for limited screen time in childcare, preschool, kindergarten
- SB248: Allow students to leave campus for religious instruction

ELECTIONS

- HB67: Voter Data Protection. Reduces cost to \$1k, further restricts data citizens can access for voter roll audits
- HB95: Post Election Audits. Audit in name only bill
- HB214: Prohibit campaign contributions from foreign nationals
- SB24: Voting Rights Restoration Act. Board of Pardons will post on their website and notify SoS of individuals who apply and are granted restoration of voting rights/pardoned
- SB92: Prohibits campaigns from accepting online credit card donations tied to foreign billing addresses

HEALTHCARE

- SB9: Clean Indoor Air Act. Indoor vaping restrictions – similar to smoking in public
- SB63: Regulates insurers' use of AI for coverage determinations. Requires a healthcare professional for final denials/reductions

RULE OF LAW

- HB37: Fleeing law enforcement on foot or on car felony charge
- HB41: Makes 1ST degree sex crimes against child under 12 capital offense
- HB7: Increased penalties for hoax threats against schools/hospitals
HB78: Early development guidelines for limited screen time

OTHER

- HB161: Requires app store providers to implement age verification, parental consent, and data protections for minors downloading/purchasing apps
- HB475: Expands Public Service Commission from 3 to 7, freezes rate increases until 2029, Creates Sec of Energy position
- SB270: Requires large-load data centers to cover costs of grid/infrastructure upgrades

OTHER

- SB71: Prohibits state agencies from adopting environmental regulations stricter than federal standards.
- SB138: Prohibit franchisor from requiring franchisee to operate on religious day
- SB41: Further penalizes those convicted to elder abuse

DID NOT PASS

- HB541: Closed Primary bill. died in the Senate
- HB12: Right to Refuse (shots/immunizations). Died in committee
- HB486: Proposal for expansion of voting access such as no-excuse absentee voting, early in-person voting, automatic felony voting rights restoration. ADVANCED OUT OF HOUSE COMMITTEE?!
- HB13: Would have allowed law enforcement to collaborate with federal agencies on immigration enforcement. Died in Senate
- HB363: Would have made it a class C felony to interrupt worship services with unlawful protest, riot, or disorderly conduct
- HB25: Prohibit release of chemicals into the atmosphere with the intent to manipulate weather conditions, temps
- HB443: Would have made a process for Article V Convention
